The Mayor's Office on Latino Affairs (OLA) Provides Grant to Teatro de la Luna for Student Theater Workshops

With help from a grant from The Mayor's Office on Latino Affairs in the District of Columbia, nonprofit performing arts organization *Teatro de la Luna* is inviting students at Bruce Monroe Elementary School @ Park View to participate in free **Bilingual Theater Workshops**. The workshops will take place at *Casa de la Luna*, 4020 Georgia Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20011 (near the Georgia Ave/Petworth Metro station on the Green Line). Casa de la Luna is in the same neighborhood as Bruce Monroe school.

The Theater Workshops are scheduled over six Saturdays – November 23; December 7, 14, 21 and January 4, 11 - from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon. When they complete the workshops, students will show what they have learned in an artistic presentation for parents, teachers and other students at Bruce Monroe @ Park View. The presentation will be held on Monday, January 13.

Since 1991 Teatro de la Luna has worked to promote Hispanic culture and foster cross-cultural understanding between the Spanish- and English-speaking communities. In addition to the Experience Theater Program, Teatro de la Luna hosts the annual International Festival of Hispanic Theater, produces plays showcasing local actors, offers play readings in Spanish, organizes an annual Spanish poetry marathon at the U.S. Library of Congress and presents musical events.
